Dear Parents,

**“I KNOW THE PLANS I HAVE FOR YOU”, DECLARES THE LORD, “PLANS TO PROSPER YOU, AND NOT TO HARM YOU, PLANS TO GIVE YOU A HOPE AND A FUTURE.” JEREMIAH 29:11-12**

In troubling and uncertain times, these words come as great encouragement to God’s children. 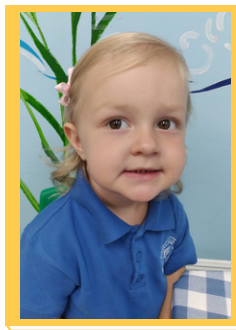
May you and your family have a very blessed Thanksgiving Holiday, and be sure to truly “give thanks” to God around the table for all that He has done!

In Language & Literacy we will be studying the beginning sounds of the letters Uu, Yy, and Ww; sequencing of stories, drawing conclusions, categorizing, predicting, describing similarities and differences, identifying specific vocabulary content, and continuing to practice independent writing skills, such as letters, words and proper names. In Math: we will continue working on counting numbers 1 - 10, recognizing numbers 8 - 10, and building sets 6-10. In Social Emotional/Content: we will review classroom/playground rules and routines. We will also do exercises that will increase sharing, cooperation and taking turns with peers. In Fine Arts we will continue creating original art works, singing a variety of simple songs, and using language as part of our dramatic play.

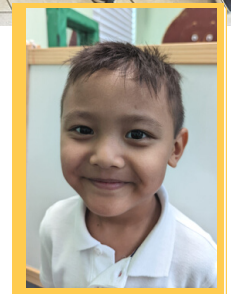

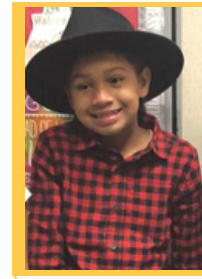

In Heritage Studies, we learned all about our neighborhood and different community helpers. For Bible, we learned about Nehemiah, Aaron, and Moses. We also discussed the importance of the Ten Commandments.

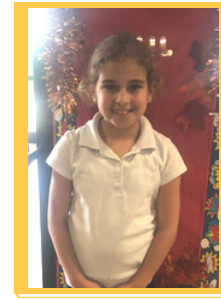

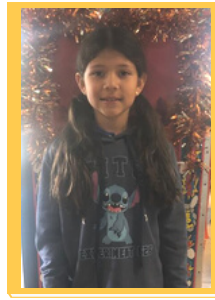

## 2ND & 3RD GRADE

October has been a wonderful and exciting month for all the students. I really enjoyed seeing you all at our Fall Open House where we spent time eating and enjoying each other as a family. The students did well in the first nine weeks. I am very proud of all my students for their hard work in each of their subject areas.

During the month of October, I've been introducing important new concepts for all subjects. In Phonics and English, we worked on how to write poetry. The students learned about different types of poems and how to write one. In Math, second grade Math students learned how to "Tell Time and use the Calendar" using manipulatives. Third graders learned about different types of "Graphs" and how to make a graph using information provided in a story problem. During our Bible class, we learned how "God Made My World". In Science, we learned about "How Matter Changes" and what the three states of matter are: solid, liquid and gas. In Heritage Studies, we studied "How Government Works". The students learned that the government of the United States has three branches: the legislative, the executive, and the judicial branches. The students also enjoyed researching different countries for their Hispanic Heritage projects.

During the month of November, we will continue learning new ideas in all areas. In Phonics and English, I will introduce "Nouns". The students will learn about proper and common nouns. Third graders will learn "Action Verbs" and with guidance we will continue writing essays. In Math, second graders will learn how to "Place Value: 2-Digit Numbers," using models and manipulatives.

The third graders will learn "Addition & subtraction: 4-5-Digit Numbers," and three digit numbers. In Science, they will learn "How Matter Moves", and I will be conducting a steam experiment. In Heritage Studies, we will be learning about "Buying and Selling" by reading the lessons and having class discussions. During Bible time this month, the students will learn all about "A Humble Heart" and how there is only one God.

I would like to congratulate Alanie Delgado as our Student of the Month. She is doing a great job academically. I would also like to congratulate Isabella Vega as our Star Student. Isabella constantly demonstrates godly characteristics of love and caring. We will all continue learning and enjoying all of our subject areas in new and fun ways.
